Land at East Road, East Road, Egremont

No objections - The Council's own independent Retail Impact Assessment shows no significant adverse impact on Egremont town centre. Furthermore, there is no reason to refuse planning permission based on national or local planning policy in relation to retail.

There are no longer any objections from Highways England as of 30th October nor Cumberland Council's highway department (28th October)

Egremont Town Council are in support of the redevelopment of a brownfield site that has overwhelming support from the local community, will create jobs & investment in Egremont and is supported by national and local planning policy.

Egremont Town Council request that if Cumberland Council ultimately agree for the tree to be felled then two replacement trees should be replanted on land in Cumberland's ownership and within the Egremont conservation area to ensure that both the amenity value of the existing tree and the ecological value of the tree to local bio diversity are not lost.

It was reported that tenants are willing to help with remedial work if the Town Council would arrange for the purchase & delivery of stones.

EW said a meeting would be arranged to discuss progression of the potential restoration of the chapels.

EW said that DW had contacted S Woodford from Cumberland Council about the heritage of the chapels but he has not had a response as yet.

The front door to Cemetery house is rotten and as the building is listed a replacement must be like for like. The door is made of solid wood and is an unusual shape, one quote received states £5,000, a second quote is awaited.

The Cemetery Curator was a little concerned about a hole in the boundary wall, RESOLVED that GS & GC will take a look.

122.24.25	COUNCILLORS' MATTERS — AN OPPORTUNITY FOR COUNCILLORS TO RAISE MINOR MATTERS NOT ON THIS AGENDA AND NOT FOR DISCUSSION GC said he was to meet with Cllr Graham Minshaw to further discuss the rear gardens of Rusper Drive, Moor Row which have encroached onto the public footpath. Councillors had heard that the former Age UK building had been purchased which was good news, it did raise the question about the land at the rear of the building where the gurning statue is in situ. As Cumberland Council own this piece of land, it was RESOLVED that if this land is to be used for something other than what it is now, the statue could be moved and suggestions were Egremont Castle	GC
	or incorporated into the former Red Lion plans. As EW sits on the Borderlands Committee, it was RESOLVED that she passes this request onto Diane Ward at Cumberland Council. DW said that it was unfortunate that the Winter Wonderland event had to be cancelled & he wondered if going forward, if would it would be beneficial for other groups to work together e.g. Amenity Committee & Crab Fair Committee to support all events held in the town. On behalf of the Amenity Committee, EW explained that this had been muted in the past as it is known that funding is more easily obtained if applied for as one events group however the Crab Fair committee were not interested. DW asked why stalls booked for the cancelled outside event could not have set up in the Market Hall. EW said it would have been very difficult to choose a small number from those stalls to fit in the hall as there was no fair way of prioritising them.
